A beloved fixture in the world of anime, Horikawa is known world-wide as the voice of Dragon Ball's Vegeta, having portrayed for more than 28 years, starting with the character's debut on *Dragon Ball Z* in 1989 and continuing to today on *Dragon Ball Super*.

On Monday, July 3, at the Dragon Ball Super Panel: Presented by Funimation and Toei Animation Inc., an exclusive panel presentation celebrating the past, present and future of Dragon Ball, Horikawa will share amazing stories from his long career as well as discuss Dragon Ball's enduring global influence.
